- South Manatee Library, 6081 26th Street W., Fri., Sept. 22 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Fri., Sept. 29 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Myakka City Fire Station 2, 26636 State Road 70, Myakka City from noon until 9 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 20 and Mon., Sept. 25 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Island Library, 5701 Marina Dr., Sat., Sept. 23 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Duette Fire Department, 35800 State Road 62 in Duette, on Sunday, Sept. 24 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Rocky Bluff Library, 6750 US Highway 301 North, Ellenton, on Wed., Sept. 27 from noon until 8 p.m.

- A description of the damage
- Information about insurance coverage
- A telephone number
- A mailing address
- Bank account and routing numbers for direct deposit of funds
